Israel Bettan (1889-1957), was Professor of Midrash and Homiletics at the Hebrew Union College, Cincinnati, Ohio. President of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, Chair of its Responsa Committee. Author of Studies in Jewish Preaching in the Middle Ages (1939), The Five Scrolls (1950).

David Ellenson is I. H and Anna Grancell Professor of Jewish Religious Thought at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, Los Angeles, California. His books include *Tradition in Transition* (1989), Rabbi Esriel Hildesheimer and the Creation of a Modern Jewish Orthodoxy (1990) and Between Tradition and Culture: The Dialectics of Modern Jewish Religion and Identity (1994).

Solomon B. Freehof (1893-1990) was Rabbi of the Rodef Shalom Congregation, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Past President of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, and the World Union for Progressive Judaism; he was past Chair of the Responsa Committee of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, and the author of twenty-six books including eight volumes of responsa, Reform Jewish Practice (1947, 1952), The Responsa Literature (1955), A Treasury of Responsa (1963), Reform Responsa for our Time (1977), Today's Reform Responsa, (1990).

Walter Jacob is Senior Scholar of the Rodef Shalom Congregation, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Past President of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, past Chair of the Responsa Committee; President of the Freehof Institute of Progressive Halakhah and the Associated American Jewish Museums. Author and editor of twenty-five books including Questions and Reform Jewish Answers (1991), The Healing Past: Pharmaceuticals in the Biblical and Rabbinic World (1993),

Israel and the Diaspora in Jewish Law (1997), Aging and the Aged in Jewish Law (1998), Die Lehren des Judentums (1999).

Peter Knobel is rabbi of Beth Emet, Evanston, Illinois. Chair of the Liturgy Committee of the Central Conference of American Rabbis; the author of numerous scholarly articles; he is editor of Gates of the Season (1983), Duties of the Soul, The Role of Commandments in Liberal Judaism (1999), and of the new American Reform prayer book..

Daniel Schiff is Rabbi of Temple B'nai Israel, McKeesport, Pennsylvania, Community Scholar of the Jewish Education Institute of Pittsburgh. Member of the Responsa Committee of the Central Conference of American Rabbis.

Ariel Stone is Associate Rabbi of Congregation Beth Israel of Portland, Oregon. While serving the Progressive congregation in Kiev, she also led services at the city's Karaite synagogue. Her research has included the Karaites, heresy in Talmudic Judaism, and bioethics.
